I. Personnel

The personnel situation has remained stable for the first quarter.

II. <u>Internal Activities</u>

- 1. The budget requests for fiscal year 1977-78 have been sent to the Finance Committee. To date no response has been received.
- 2. Warrant articles for May's town meeting were submitted. Articles were presented for acceptance of state funds and for library addition planning money.
- 3. The library's annual report has been submitted for inclusion in the Town's Annual Report.
- 4. We are in the process of conducting an inventory of library furnishings as requested by the selectmen for insurance purposes.
- 5. Due to numerous requests for literary criticisms of American authors, a number of collection building books have been ordered on this subject. Also, we are beginning to subscribe to several literary periodicals. Currently the 600's, i.e., medicine, technology, home economics, business, etc., are being appraised.
- 6. The adult non-fiction weeding project continues.
