## Volunteer to Deliver Library Materials to Homebound Residents

The M.G. Parker Library is always looking for dedicated volunteers to deliver and pick up library materials to homebound residents who, for one reason or another, are unable to visit the library on their own.

Volunteers are matched up with participants in the program. On average, you will be asked to visit residents twice per month.

To qualify to be a volunteer you must be over the age of 18 and be physically able to deliver library materials. You must possess a valid, Massachusetts Driver's License, submit to and pass a CORI (Criminal Offence Record Information) check, and have proof of current auto insurance. You should also be comfortable working with older adults and the disabled.

## Library Delivery to the Homebound



The Dracut Library's Homebound Delivery Program brings library materials to homebound residents of Dracut each month. Trained volunteers visit

homebound residents to deliver or pick up library materials. The Library staff selects books and other materials according to the preferences of the homebound users.

### Who Can Use This Service?

To be eligible for this service you must be a Dracut resident and unable to come to the library due to a permanent condition, or a temporary condition that will last four weeks or more. For example, you may no longer be able to drive, have mobility problems, require extended bed rest, or have a broken leg.

### How Do I Apply?

To apply for Homebound Services, fill out the application that is included in this brochure, and mail or have someone take it to the M.G. Parker Memorial Library (mailing address is on the application). You will need to have a library card in order to use this service. If you

don't already have one, you will need to call the library at 978-454-5474 and ask for the Homebound Delivery program.

### What Can I Expect From Homebound Services?

Once you have returned the completed application, a Library staff member will contact you to set up a schedule. During that phone call, we will establish a delivery schedule and determine how many items you would like to receive at a time (up to 10 items). You may choose your own items, or have a staff member choose items for you, based on your preferences.

After this introductory phone call, you will be matched with one of our Home Delivery volunteers. These are dedicated community members who donate valuable time in order to help us run this service. All volunteers will have completed and passed a CORI check before they are allowed to come to your home.
