Mom's WWII Letters: Reconstructing History & Genealogy



Tuesday, April 2nd 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM

In May 2017, Corinne Smith found her Mother's stash of letters from 16 servicemen that she had corresponded with in 1944-45. Most of the them were from her Mother's hometown of Allentown, Pennsylvania, or her college roommate's hometown of Trenton, New Jersey. Nearly all of the writers were now gone and could no longer offer information or explanations for what they had written. Corinne began to trace the soldiers' family trees with one goal in mind: to return the letters in person to their children.

Learn about her on-going project, and hear some of the stories of the men, their experiences and what their relatives had to say. This presentation links history and genealogy to present-day research and diligence.

Austen in April



Join us during the month of April for a celebration of all things Jane Austen!

Portrait of a Lady Wednesday, April 3rd 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM In 2017, the two hundredth Anniversary of her death, Jane Austen appeared on both the two-pound coin and the ten-pound note. The only female to feature more prominently on British currency is Queen Elizabeth II, one of the most recognizable faces in the world.

But what did Jane Austen, the most famous female writer in the world, actually look like? Austen's face throughout two centuries, has, like the writer herself, been reticent. This program will look at the few possible portraits of the writer that exist, and examine their authenticity.

Price Grisham completed his Master's thesis on Jane Austen and the Anglican church, and is a member of the Salem Athenaeum, where he lectures on the subject. His short story "Candour" was published in *Bequiling* Miss Bennett. He presented a requested paper on Jane Austen and the Anglican Church in the summer of 2015 at the Chawton House Library in England, an estate of Austen's brother which is now a literary research center on women writers in the 19th century and earlier.

Come and discuss one of Jane Austen's most popular novels, in a comfy setting. Elinor and Marianne Dashwood remain to this day two of literature's most beloved characters. We will be meeting in the Old Building by the fireplace to speak about them as well as the myriad of rich characters and settings found in this great work. We hope to see you there!

Musicking In Jane Austen's England Wednesday, April 10th 6:00 PM - 8:00 PM

Come and hear this energizing lecture and performance of historical music!

Why does Mary Crawford play the harp? Why does Lady Middleton give up the pianoforte "in celebration" of her marriage? What does it signify that Mary Bennett studies "thorough bass"? The scarcity of clarifying details Austen gives has perhaps allowed us to overlook these references as mere minutiae, when, on the contrary, it is exactly this scarcity that indicates Austen took for granted the pervasiveness and importance of music in everyday Georgian life.

In this lecture | performance, Lidia Chang will investigate the soundscape in which Austen's characters exist and expand outward to consider the broader sound world in which Austen herself lived, examining domestic music practices as well as public concerts.

Though Jane Austen's (Anne Hathaway) financially strapped parents (James Cromwell, Julie Walters) expect her to marry the nephew of wealthy Lady Gresham (Maggie Smith), the young woman knows that such a union will destroy her creativity and sense of self-worth. Instead, she becomes involved with Tom Lefroy (James McAvoy), a charming but penniless apprentice lawyer who gives her the knowledge of the heart she needs for her future career as a novelist.

Rated MPAA PG for brief nudity and mild language.

Film Screening: *Emma* Wednesday, April 17th 6:00 PM - 8:15 PM

In this adaptation of Jane Austen's classic novel, pretty socialite Emma Woodhouse (Gwvneth Paltrow) entertains herself by playing matchmaker for those around her. Her latest "project" is Harriet Smith, an unpretentious debutant, while Emma herself receives the attentions of the dashing Frank Churchill (Ewan McGregor). However, Emma's attempts at matchmaking cause more problems than solutions and may ultimately jeopardize her own chance at love and happiness.


