A realist artist who uses pencil drawings, pen and ink, watercolor, acrylics and oils, Mahfuz has taken courses at the Museum of Fine Arts and the New England School of Art in Boston.

Major influences include the works of Pino Daeni, Will Eisner, Virgil Finlay, Frank Frazetta, Basil Gogos, Winslow Homer, Everett Raymond Kinstler, Jack Kirby, Winsor McCay, and Alphonse Mucha. Children's Read and Bead Is Back!

Our Read & Bead Summer Reading Rewards Program

begins on June 18th for children age 3 to entering grade 5. Come in between 10:00 am and 7:00 pm to register and get your log. Can't come on the 18th? No problem. Come any Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday between 10:00 am and 7:00 pm, or Thursday and Friday between 10:00 am and 4:00 pm. You can't start counting minutes until you register and get your log.

How does it work? You read at home and circle the time you spend reading each day (younger children count the time they are read to). Earn a bead for every 15 minutes you read, up to 60 minutes a day. Collect the beads on your necklace. Earn a brag tag when you have completed the first 120 minutes of reading. You can trade your beads for glitter, metallic, and different shaped beads. Make your own unique necklace!

The program ends August 16th at 4:00 pm. However, you have until August 31st to collect your final beads.

Children attending Dracut elementary schools will be rewarded with an ice cream party at their

school in September if they read for at least 2 hours each week.
