Good Day,

I hope that this newsletter finds you and yours happy and healthy.

Summer is in full swing and the

Parker Library is gearing up to offer a variety of virtual programs to you.

The safety of our staff and our patrons is of the utmost importance to us. In conjunction with the Town Manager and the Dracut Board of Health, we have begun a phased plan to re-open library services.

Starting June 8th, we began offering our Library Take-Out service, which allows you to place holds and pick-up those holds curbside at the library. At this time, only materials owned by our library are available, as Statewide Delivery Service was suspended due to the COVID-19 health emergency. Optima, our delivery company, recently started up delivery again, though it will take some time for them to get caught up on delivering all the materials that have been held in the warehouse for three months.

Soon, our online catalog will once again show the collections of the other libraries that make up the Merrimack Valley Library Consortium (MVLCC). At that time, you may place holds on those items,

though you should expect longer wait times to receive them.

We are looking forward to welcoming you back to the library in Phase 2 of our re-opening plan, which you will also be able to read about in this month's newsletter.

LIBRARY TAKE-OUT

Library Take-Out is Easy!

Place items on hold in the Library's online catalog, or by calling us at 978-454-5474.

We will notify you by phone or email when your items are available for pick-up.

Once you have received notice, you need to call us to set up a pick-up time and get your bin number.

Your take-out items will be placed in a bag and put in a numbered bin at the back of the library.

You will drive up, following the signs, to retrieve your items.

Take the items from the bin with the number you were given at the time of your phone reservation.

Exit straight ahead, through the church parking lot onto Bridge Street.

How Do I Place an Order?

It's easy! If you know what you want, login to our online catalog and make your request. If you're not sure what you want, you can call the library and ask for suggestions, based on the kind of book you like to read, or topic that you are interested in, and a staff member will help you. Please note that Statewide Delivery Service among libraries (ILL) has not been restored at this time, so we are only able to lend you what is available at the Dracut Public Library.

Hours of Library Take-out Service

Starting June 8th, you may pick up your confirmed orders only during the following times (you must have a reservation).

Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. (These hours may change due to rain, or as we assess demand and community needs).

Returns

Please continue to return your items through the book drop in the front of the building.

PHASE 2: LIMITED ACCESS

We want to re-open when it is safe for both you and the staff. We understand that it is frustrating to wait to use in-person services again. We appreciate your patience.

With safety foremost in our minds, we will begin Phase 2 of our re-opening plan on Wednesday, July 8th.

Phase 2 allows for limited access to the library building. Library Take-Out will still be offered.

During this phase, no more than 25 people (including staff) will be allowed in the building at any given time.

All patrons (and staff) must put on a mask before entering the building and keep it on (unless in individual offices) for the duration of their stay.

All patrons (and staff) must use hand sanitizer before entering the building, and maintain social distancing.

Entrance and exit from the building will be one way.

Access will be available to the 1st floor, excluding the Children's

Room and the Meeting Room.

Patrons requiring materials held on the 2nd floor or in the Children's room, may ask a staff member to retrieve them.

Bibliolabs Launches Virtual Library Comic Convention (VLCC) Making over 4000 Comics & Graphic Novels Available to all Massachusetts Residents!

This project is a collaboration with 9 other states and is intended to provide easy access to digital resources while also supporting statewide summer reading programs for all ages during the COVID-19 period. More eBooks will be released throughout the summer from additional children's, comic book, and science fiction publishers.

Massachusetts is also participating in a VLCC online event, to be held on July 30th, featuring interactive sessions with leading talent as well as librarians talking about grassroots graphic novel creation and local zine publishing programs available through public libraries. More details on the online event will be released soon.

All of the eBooks are available in an unlimited simultaneous use model and served to patrons via geolocation. The VLCC collection will be free to libraries and patrons in participating states through

August 31st, serving as a valuable tool in statewide summer reading program support for all libraries.

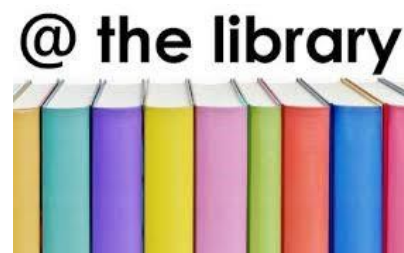
